












# Get guests

#### What guest preparation looks like

- Be comfortable asking people to join
  - Keep it concise, flattering, and simple to setup
- Before recording...
  - Prepare any questions you'd like to ask
  - Ask the guest if there's anything they'd like to talk about
- Make the guest the star of the episode
- Give them a platform to share where people can find them

## Get guests


#### What unwanted guests look like

- Know your audience
  - If it's not a good fit, politely pass (or ignore)

  - Do an introductory call- ask them to chat with you and feel it out
















#### **Stay steady**What that looks like
